Scholarship Information Sheet

Survivor Scholarship Program Childhood Cancer Canada's Scholarship Program is open to young adult cancer survivors who are residents, and currently residing in Canada. The Program supports post-secondary academic endeavors and recognizes the personal triumphs of exemplary students who have survived a childhood cancer journey (diagnosed age 18 years or younger).

\$1,500 Childhood Cancer Canada Survivor Scholarship: One-time award for students in any university, college, or vocational training program. Students may be in any year of their studies provided that they are enrolled in school for the fall term that the scholarships are awarded in.

\$5,000 TEVA Canada Scholarship: A one-time award that will be granted to a maximum of 10 students entering (or already enrolled in) pharmacy, medicine, or health sciences post-graduate programs of study. Students may be in any year of their studies provided that they are enrolled in school for the fall term that the scholarships are awarded in.

Spiritual Warrior Scholarship

Four \$2000 awards given to young Canadians that are planning to enter first year in post secondary education who demonstrate qualities that best capture creativity, inspiration, and being community-minded.

Eligibility

- Canadian citizen

- Living/Working/Attended secondary school in Waterloo Region, Upper Grand, and Wellington Catholic District School Boards
- Cancer personally or through family members

How to Apply

- Application (mailed); essay emailed (Word/RTF) to office@hopespring.ca
- Essay/Personal story about cancer experience including the impact, how you responded/coped with challenges you have encountered, efforts you have taken to help others who encountered this disease, what you have discovered about yourself, qualities that capture the spirit (not exceed 1000 words)
- 2 personal reference letters
- Most recent transcript

Typically Canadian OPFFA Scholarship

Two to four scholarships (varies depending on the amount raised) to provide financial support for young Canadian cancer survivors between the age of 17-24 in any university in Canada

Eligibility

- Diagnosis before 19th birthday
- Canadian citizen/permanent resident

Eligibility

- member of Candlelighters Childhood Cancer Support Programs
- childhood cancer or still in treatment

How to Apply

- Letter of reference from teacher
- Letter of interest describing: future academic goals, why you are applying and volunteer work

Carlson Wagonlit Bursary

\$1000 towards young adults between the age of 17-21 in their academic pursuits of post secondary education, awarded only **once** in the course of your education

GOOGLE LIME SCHOLARSHIP

In graduating year of high school OR CEGEP students OR currently enrolled full-time in a recognized Canadian university or college
Who's Eligible

Students with disabilities who are enrolled or plan to enroll at an accredited post-secondary institution in the U.S. or Canada and plan to pursue a degree in computer science, computer engineering, or a closely-related technical field. International students may also apply.

What It Covers

Recipients of the scholarship in the U.S. will receive an award amount of \$10,000. Recipients in Canada will receive \$5,000.
