I am participating in the Tour of Hope 2021 to raise money for children like Willa who are battling cancer. Here is Willa's story:



Willa loves stickers, painting, helping in the kitchen, and watching some of her favorite movies with her family.

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Five of us had quite a LONG ride yesterday. Carl, one of our leaders from the Tour of Hope, 2019, is riding 100 km./day, four days in a row this weekend and I joined him and four others for a ride from the Olympiette yesterday morning. We had a guest rider, Ann, who was part of the Tour for a few years beginning in 2008, Andree who I've mentioned before, Carl, myself, and Rachelle, a young lady who first participated in 2019 and came up from Calgary to ride with Carl this weekend.
