

Who we are

The Kids with Cancer Society provides unique, vital programs and services free of charge to children diagnosed with cancer and their families, residing in Northern Alberta and the NWT.

Many families describe the Kids with Cancer Society as a lifeline when their lives have been turned upside down by a cancer diagnosis. We serve families from the time of diagnosis, through treatment, survivorship and beyond, no matter the diagnosis or treatment.

Our programs and services address their unique and complex needs ranging from family support programs and activities, peer support, counselling services, financial support and educational support. We also fund ground breaking pediatric cancer research and provide support to the pediatric oncology unit at the Stollery Children's Hospital.

Ava's Story

As school was winding down for 2023-2024, Ava was excited for summer to start. She had every intention of finding a summer job and starting the path to achieving her goals. She was handing out resumes and decided to try outdoor soccer...except she wasn't 'feeling good. Ava was increasingly fatigued and couldn't seem to overcome feeling tired. There were multiple trips to the ER. At the end of June, Ava caught a stomach bug and couldn't seem to recover. One more visit to our family doctor to get some answers. Except this time, we got a result we were not expecting and were told proceed immediately to the Stollery Emergency Department immediately.



"Just as quickly as the Oncology team began their care and management of Ava's leukemia, the Kids with Cancer Society were there providing their support. Blair, KWCS Family Services Manager and a staple and constant presence at the hospital, provided comfort and reassurance during those chaotic first days. He calmly and compassionately informed us that we would not be on this journey alone. He gave Ava a backpack full of items often needed in a hospital stay." - Ava's family

Finding an answer for Ava included lumbar puncture, bone marrow, and countless blood tests. Within 48 hours, she was diagnosed with Acute Lymphoblastic Leukemia—ALL less than one month before her 16th birthday.

KWCS supports were immediately offered to us, including access to financial assistance to help ease the unexpected costs associated with constant travel and admissions to the hospital. Programs were identified where Ava could meet and socialize with other kids who have been diagnosed with Cancer. Cancer patients and families are offered access to programs to help with coping such as counselling, educational assistance for diagnosed kids, and transitioning back to school when and if Ava would be ready.

Even though processing this drastic change in Ava and our lives took some time, it was truly a relief to know that we would have the reassurance and support from the Kids with Cancer Society to rely on whenever Ava or our family should need.

Ira's Story

Ira is our busy 7-year-old little man who loves Mario Kart, his Yoto, Taekwondo, playing with his siblings and looking forward to the many KWCS events throughout the year (especially Family Camp, the Christmas Party and H4H). Ira can't get enough of pizza and fries. He is in grade 1 and enjoying playing with new friends. He has a spectacular memory and a great sense of humour. We cherish each moment and every milestone that he reaches.

Ira was diagnosed with a tumour in his mid-brain in October 2022 at the age of 4. His diagnosis happened very quickly and like all parents who have experienced a critically ill child, we were not prepared for how much our lives would change in one instant. We went from a healthy preschooler to a week in the PICU and four weeks inpatient at the Stollery. While in the hospital, Ira underwent 6 brain surgeries and has had one additional surgery since his initial discharge.

Our family currently accesses programs through the KWCS like counselling services and the BrainWorks Program. Ira also anticipates visiting the KWCS house after every hospital visit. It is a bright spot at the end of sometimes hard days. The KWCS events have created amazing opportunities for our family to make beautiful memories outside of Ira's diagnosis and we have formed relationships with other families with shared experiences to ours.

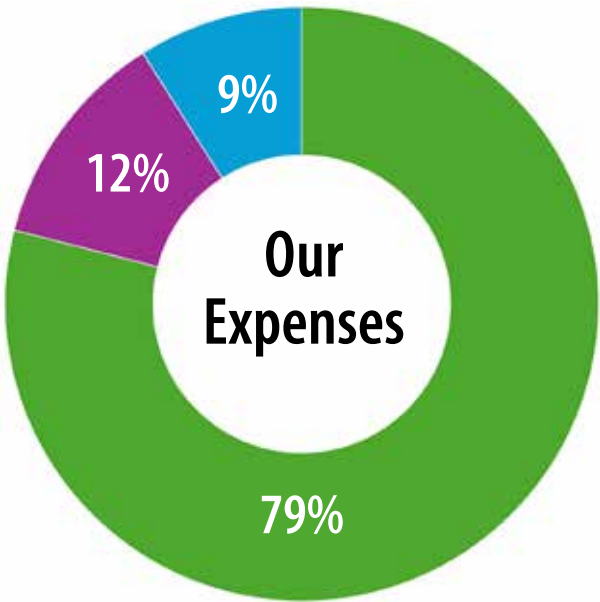
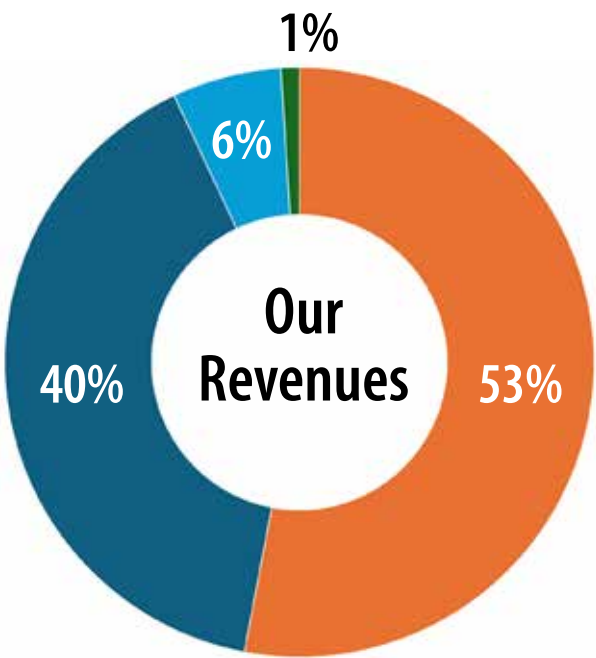

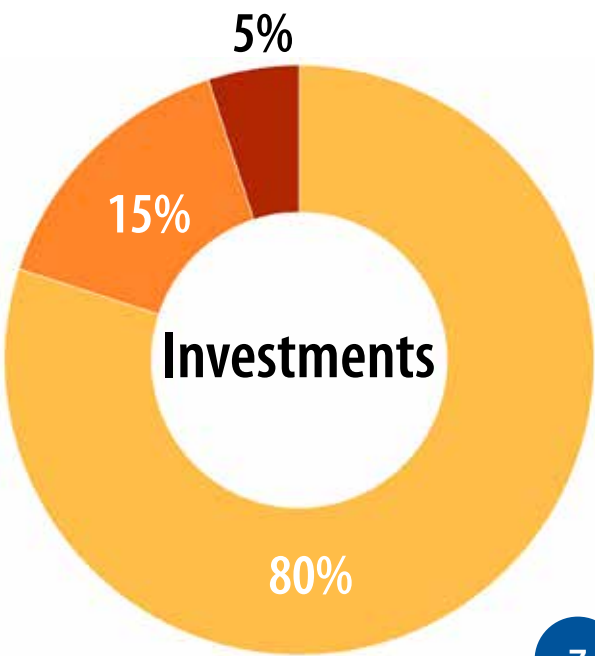
